

November BAH hosted by Franklin Savings Bank




The Franklin County Chamber of Commerce's November Business After Hours was hosted by Franklin Savings Bank and put the focus on giving thanks and giving back.



Farmington Auxiliary

The Farmington Auxiliary is an organization in support of Franklin Memorial Hospital that raises money throughout the year through various fundraising events. All proceeds are donated back to the hospital for expenses that are not in their budget. On average, the Auxiliary donates between \$20,000-\$25,000 dollars per year to the hospital.

The Auxiliary has done numerous fundraising events to help raise money for the hospital including bake sales, bag/purse sales, uniform sales, book and gift sales as well as sales made from their gift shop located in the Franklin Memorial Hospital. Their gift shop includes a variety of items that family members can purchase for patients including Willow Tree figurines, jewelry, newborn items, flowers, stuffed animals and other assorted goods.



Stones are available to be purchased with loved ones names on them to be placed in the beautiful healing garden outside of the hospital. People can also purchase snowflakes with their loved one's name written on them to be placed on a Christmas tree displayed in the hospital's lobby during the holidays.

Another way the Auxiliary supports the hospital is by giving eight scholarships a year to area students going to school in the medical field.
