They say that play is good for the soul, and that's exactly what Dan Ryder and Emily Buckhalter (Pottle, at the time) had in mind when they started discussing the idea of an adult improv group in the Farmington area in the fall of 2007. They called upon two other Curtain Raiser alums, Kyla Wheeler and Alex Kreitzman, a former member of UMF's Lawn Chair Pirates. Natalie Simmons (nee Bean). and cajoled Dan's best friend, Jeff Bailey. Armed with the knowledge that they all loved making people laugh and were the living definition of "rag tag," put together a holiday show, lovingly titled "Stale Milk and Sour Cookies."

Since that show, they have performed throughout the state and the northeast, performing their own particular brand of improv comedy. One part, "Whose Line Is It, Anyway?" one part Second City, and two parts something altogether original, they deliver original stories and scenes based on audience suggestions. Some shows feel like a night of party


games, while others feel like a zations have all worked with visit to the theater. The group prides itself in custom tailoring their performances to their audiences.
