

# The Stanley Museum

The Stanley Museum in Kingfield shares the traditions of Yankee ingenuity and creativity. When you think of the Stanley family you think of the Stanley Steamer automobile. 10,800 Stanley Steamers were produced from 1902 to 1925. The first room you visit at the museum is the car room with Stanley steam automobiles on display. A 20 hp Stanley engine along with boiler and burner on exhibit demonstrate how the Stanley car is powered.

As you continue your visit of the Stanley Museum you will enter the family room with exhibits of the Stanley's other interests and accomplishments. The Stanley Dry Plate Co. story is told through an exhibit of vintage camera equipment, black & white photographs and information panels. The photography display includes many pho-

tograhic prints and glass plate negatives created by the Stanleys' sister, Chansonetta. Among the displays are her brilliantly handcolored glass lantern slides.

Many of the Stanley family members were artistic. Their talent is shown through paintings around the family room. One painting by F.E. is of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. Violins were made by F.O., F.E, and their nephew Carlton and are on display. The Stanley museum by telling of the Stanley family creativity and ingenuity looks to inspire those values in others.

Look for events in 2016 as the Stanley Museum joins in Kingfield's bicentennial celebration.
