MEMBER SPOTLIGHT:

Maine Huts and Trails

Maine Huts and Trails is a small non-profit organization founded by Larry Warren. His vision of having a series of backcountry huts throughout Maine's lakes and mountains region was first realized in 2008 when the first hut was built. Now with four off-the-grid ecofriendly lodges available and maintained by the staff, people have access to a wellgroomed and well-marked trail system with the huts averaging about 10 miles in between. The trail system spans over 80 miles where guests can hike, mountain bike, ski or snowshoe along beautiful trails with breathtaking views.

Located throughout the Kingfield/ Carrabassett Valley region of Western Maine, Maine Huts and Trails are open year-round with two fullservice seasons available, one from the beginning of July to mid-October and one from mid-December to the end of March. There are two to three hut staff at each hut, cooking meals for the guests and providing assistance to anyone who needs it. During a full-service stay, guests are provided with a breakfast. lunch and dinner cooked by the staff using mostly locally grown, organic ingredients. There is also a beer and wine menu. After dinner the guests are given a tour of how the huts are run and operated using their own solar and hydro power. If guests decide to come during a time where full-service is not available, lodges are still available to stay in with reduced price but guests will have to bring their own food that they can cook using the kitchen with a pack in, pack out policy.



Membership is available to those who wish to support the organization and receive discounts off lodges, wines and retail items. All funds go right to trail and hut maintenance. To book a reservation call (207) 265-2400 or visit their website www.mainehuts.org for more information.
